Upon Consideration of y<sup>e</sup> petition of Ann Young w<sup>th</sup> wife of Jacob Young, This house think it not well to be concerned therein as desired. The business being more properly before his Lord<sup>t</sup>: to whom the Petitioner ought to apply.

Ordered that Mr. Richard Hill a Member of this house inform the Petitioner accordingly.

M<sup>r</sup> Carville and M<sup>r</sup> Price sent to y<sup>e</sup> Bp<sup>t</sup>: house with y<sup>e</sup> Bill for Naturalizing Andrew Soulson be referred to, and the Bill for Naturalizing Nicholas Verbraack not referred to, and Ordered that the Messengers acquaint y<sup>e</sup> Bp<sup>t</sup>: house y<sup>e</sup> reason why Verbraack's Bill is not referred to is because the said Verbraack is no inhabitant of this Province as is suggested.

They retaine and say they have delivered the same.

Then was read a Bill Entituled an Act for reviving y<sup>e</sup> Temporary Laws the second time.

Capt. Hill sent to the upper house for y<sup>e</sup> booke of Laws.

He retaines and brings it with him.

Then was read an act Entituled an Act Limiting the Extent of Attachment and providing what shall be levied on attachment and Execution, the third time and passed this house -

M<sup>r</sup> Winford and M<sup>r</sup> Hatton, sent to y<sup>e</sup> Bp<sup>t</sup>: house with y<sup>e</sup> Bill.

They retaine and say they have delivered the same.

Bp<sup>t</sup>: house 27<sup>th</sup> of October 1683.

Since the Bill for the Advancement of Trade is approved on and believed both by the Upper and Lower houses of this Assembly to be an Act of great and Generall good to this Province, and the trade thereof. This house doe once more desire y<sup>e</sup> Lower house take it againe into their Consideration and pass the same in the Lower house in order to making the same an act.
