morrow in the afternoon at which time he will then conclude
this Sessions of Assembly.

shall bee forthwith putt to the vote, for its passage Yea or Nay.
Voted in the affirmative. The Question was then putt whether the
Bill for Advancement of Trade shall pass this house, Yea or Nay.
Resolved in the affirmative and the Clerk Comanded to signe it &
accordingly.

Lower House of Assembly October 29th 1683.

This House desires the upper House to joine with this House to pray his
Lords to give his assent to if bill directing the manner of Electing Burgesses
&c. And the bill touching Levying of warre, and defraying the publique Charge
of the Province, being two bills so absolutely Necessary to build our peace
upon that his Lords Consideration thereunto will assure us of our future
Happiness and tranquility under his Lords Government.
