

This House have appointed Col^l. Vincent Lowe and Mr. Feery Dainall Members of this House to joyn with Mr. Robert Cavile and Mr. John Rowley as a Committee for drawing y^e bill of Revivall of y^e temporary Lawes, to present to Morrow at Nine a Clock in y^e Morning.

The Committee Report their proceedings hitherto to this House, and desire to know how much is necessary to be allowed to Thomas Pew, the public post of this Province, for his Graves wages.

Voted he be allowed 6000^s of tobacco for this grave.

Col^l. Stevent from the upper house brings the bill for regulating y^e laws and abuses in tobacco hogsheads, assented too by the upper house, also a message, which being read is as followeth (viz^t.)

This House have presented to his L^op. their supplication for stay of the day of Sessions for some time longer, whereupon his Lordship hath been pleased to sett Monday next for the day of Sessions, to y^e Intent that all things now on foot in either house may be fully debated and come to a final and amicable end which this House hopes is the wish and desire of the Lower House as well as this.

Mr. Feery Dainall acquaints this House, that the upper house hath appointed to Morrow for hearing y^e Enow in y^e Upper House of Assembly.

Mr. Clement Hill acquaints this House, that he is informed by severall of the Inhabitants of St. Marys County, that y^e place appointed for a Towne in Brittons Bay is very Inconvenient, in respect the Inhabitants thereabouts must be forc^t to come out of Clements Bay to y^e same. Whereas if the Towne were seated upon Brittons Neck on y^e other side of the said Bay the Inhabitants of each bay might land at the same Towne in their respective Bays.

Ordered that Mr. Clement Hill may have Liberty to supplicate his L^op. for alteration of the same, and if the Bill for advancement of trade may be sent downe to this House, to be amended and read upon y^e Amendments as by the Rules of this House it ought. this House is willing y^e said Bill should be mended.
