when council reading was voted the following Message (Nov: 1)
Lower House of Assembly Nov: first 1683.

This day the Right Hon^{ble} & Lord Proprietor, having at the humble supplication of the Inhabitants of S^t. M^arye County expressed his willingness (as this house is informed) that one of the places or ports mentioned in the bill for Advancement of Trade, appointed to be att taunts or Bayleys land in Brittons Bay should be changed or transferred to Brittons Neck (near the mouth of the S^t. Bay), his Lord: being assured that y^e said Brittons Neck will be much more convenient for the Inhabitants of those parts in general than y^e former. This house desire y^e Upper house to send down y^e said bill for Advancement of trade; to be mended in particular, and this house will return the said bill to y^e Upp^r house amended in that part only to y^e Upp^r house

Which being read and signed was sent to the upper house by Capt. Smith and Mr. Hutton.

They Utterne and say they have delivered the same to Major Freeman, brings from the upper house an Acct. of y^e Prisoner of Jacob Young: with his petition and Judgment thereupon, which is as follows. Nov: 1st 1683. Upp^r house 1st of November 1683.

There was read y^e petition of the Orphans of Henry Lewis of Anne Arundell County deceased, and thereupon voted the following Message.

Lower house of Assembly (November 4th 1683).

The petition of the Orphans of Henry Lewis being presented and read in this house, and a Member of this house affirming to this house that the said Orphans are extremely injured, by the fraud of their said father in law, this house doe desire, the upper house to take the said petition into their serious Consideration and give direction to the judges in testamentary Causes to do the therein lot by y^e Lawes and Presidents of this Province can be done for y^e relief of the petitioners, and for securing what little remains of their property within this Province.
