

Then came Mr. Secretary Darnall and desires this House to mend their Message about Rates on Liquors, by adding $\frac{1}{2}$ quantity for which the Rates are set, which being done the Message is sent back by Capt. Smith.

Mr. Secretary Darnall comes with a Message, which being read is as followeth.

This House concurs with Lower House in $\frac{1}{2}$ Rates and prices within mentioned, Signed off Orders — Tho: Gammewin Clerk. &c.

Then was John Larkin $\frac{1}{2}$ Ordinary Keeper called into this House and ordered not to deliver any Liquors to any persons upon the Lower House's Receipt except a Member of the Lower House speaks to him for $\frac{1}{2}$ same.

The House adjourns till to Morrow Morning seven a clock.

Saturday November 7th 1683.

The House met and called, all present as yesterday.

Then was read what was done yesterday.

The Committee of Accounts Report to this House, the allowance by them made hitherto, upon such petitions, accounts and other matters as have been before them. It is thereupon ordered $\frac{1}{2}$ $\frac{1}{2}$ said Committee draw up a bill for payment of the Publick Charge accordingly.

The Committee for projecting a building for a Court House, Officers &c. present to this House a Bill intitled an Act, for $\frac{1}{2}$ erecting and building of a Court House for $\frac{1}{2}$ convenience of holding Courts of Judicature sitting of assemblies, and for keeping $\frac{1}{2}$ Secretaries office: Land office and Testamentary office in and for this province.

Col^l. Darnall brings from the Upper House a Message which was read (viz.) Upper House November 7th 1683.

In further answer to the Message of the Lower House yesterday by Capt. Richard Hill and Major Thomas Long, this House to that part thereof yet unanswered doe say that $\frac{1}{2}$ $\frac{1}{2}$ to them seems to Gen^l. and therefore cannot concur therewith, there having been a Settlement already made of all Lawes to $\frac{1}{2}$ Year 1678. by an Act intitled an Act, for Repeale of Cetyne Lawes, and alsoe for Ascertaining what Lawes within this province: since then there hath been but one Session of $\frac{1}{2}$ wherein His Lordps. was then personally present to signify His L^os. Assent. And the Lawes under severall Qualifications, some perpetuall and some temporary, and of them either fallen or disassented too, or repealed. Many temporary Lawes have been doe farre approved, and deemed soe necessary as to be confirmed by every assembly since that, and are conteyned in the Reviving bill now prepared.

Those Lawes that may be thought to want Confirmation are perpetuall and of them some publique and some private, and are as followeth: viz.

An Act for keeping Holy the Lords Day.

An Act for the due Recording of all $\frac{1}{2}$ Lawes of this province in $\frac{1}{2}$ Secretary's office — An Act for the Limiting $\frac{1}{2}$ County Clerks Fees within this prov^l.

An Act for $\frac{1}{2}$ Naturalization of Joshua Guybert.
