Which being read and signed was sent to the Upper House by Mr. Hutchings and Mr. Hutton. Mr. Secy Darnall Desires the upper Houses Bill Entitled an Act of Gratitude &c: which is delivered to him.

The Members of this House joynd in Committee, for reviewing the Temporary Lawes, Reporting to this House that the members of the upper House of the same Committee will not consent to the Reviving Act of Killing wolves This House therefore move the upper House to assent to the Reviving of the same Act standing a Temporary Law in the Booke of Lawes

Which message being read and signed was sent to the Upper House by Mr. Frisby and Mr. Hooper, who returned and say they have delivered of same. Mr. Secy Darnall Desires this House to dispatch an answer to the Upper Houses message about Jacob Young: and brings with him a message which was read as follows.

Upper House November 4<sup>th</sup> 3<sup>o</sup> 1683.

The Act for Killing Wolves this House doe say stands in the Booke of Lawes as a perpetuall Law, but in testimony of their hearty inclination fully to correspond with the Lower House in all things reasonable, are willing to reduce the same to the former state as we conceive is desired by the Lower House.

Then was sent the following answer to the message about Jacob Young's security.

Lower House of Assembly November 4<sup>th</sup> 3<sup>o</sup> 1683.

This House having taken the last message concerning Jacob Young into their consideration, doe say that if the sayd Jacob Young with the sayd securities, will stand oblig'd for his immediate removal, for Europe or be confined in some credible house in this County for some reasonable time, untill he can take shipping, not exceeding two months and that he shall not returne into this or any other Neighbouring part of America, without the Consent of His L<sup>ty</sup> and both Houses of Assembly then this House is content therewith, and will advance some tobacco towards the payment of his fees, if the upper House will concur therein.
