 10<sup>th</sup> To 11<sup>th</sup> - That a new Law is not necessary  
 11<sup>th</sup> To 12<sup>th</sup> - That the act for continuance of peace with and  
 protection of our Neighbour and Confederate Indians in Choptank  
 River, doe stand according to the true Intent and Meaning thereof.  
 12<sup>th</sup> To 13<sup>th</sup> - That the Act for Killing of Wolves is a Temporary Law.  
 The House adjourned Till Tomorrow Morning Eight a Clock.

Wednesday April 16<sup>th</sup> 1684.

The House mett Called, and all present as Yesterday.

Then was Read what was done Yesterday.

Then was the Act for punishing certaine offences against the peace  
 taken into further Consideration - And an Act of Parliament made  
 in the 13<sup>th</sup> Year of the King that now is, Entituled an Act for Safety of  
 his Majesties person and Government. Against treasonable and seditious  
 practices, was Read in this House, and the sayd Act, as also the Act  
 for punishing offences referred to a Committee to draw up a bill for  
 the Security of his Majesties person and Government accordingly.

Then the House proceeds upon the Amendment presented by the Committee  
 13<sup>th</sup> To the 13<sup>th</sup> Articles, voted that the Act for preservation of Orphans  
 Estates, made Anno 1671: was Repealed by an Act made 1681.  
 14<sup>th</sup> To the 14<sup>th</sup> Voted that the Act for the support of his Majesties stand accord-  
 ing to the true intent and Meaning thereof.

15<sup>th</sup> To 15<sup>th</sup> Voted that the Act of Gratitude to his Excellency the Stand  
 according to the true Intent and Meaning thereof.

16<sup>th</sup> To 16<sup>th</sup> Voted that the Act for Limiting of County Clerks Fees be inserted  
 into the new Transcripts.

17<sup>th</sup> To 17<sup>th</sup> Voted that the Supplementary Act to the Act for Officers Fees,  
 be Inscribed into the new Transcripts.

18<sup>th</sup> To 18<sup>th</sup> Voted that a Supplementary Act to the Act for Advancement  
 of trade be Considered of by this House.

Upon Reading of the Act for Recording the Journalls of the Lower House  
 voted that the words Adjournment be left out of the sayd Act.

Mr. Burford (Mr. Rosely) and Mr. Carville, appointed to joine with  
 the members of the Upper House in Committee to finish the Address,  
 and for drawing up a Schedule to be annexed therunto, but if it  
 happen, that the members of the upper House doe not agree with the  
 members of this House, then the members of this House are ordered to  
 prepare themselves to draw up the sayd Schedule, and present it to  
 the Consideration of this House.
