Young to have him and his baile for not appearing this assembly
and send it down to the Lower house, for their concurrence and

their members which were kept out. At last the upper house give order
for y^e members to be admitted for this time, because the more weighty
affaires now before them should not be delayed, but to bee noe rule
for the future.

The sayd members were lett in, and the Grand Committee
proceed. Then was read the address to his Lop. and the whole matter
as then settled agreed on, and consented to.
