 for Mr. members to be admitted, for this time, because the more weighty
 affaires now before them should not be delayed, but to be no rule
 for the future.

The sayd members were lett in, and the Grand Committee
 proceed. Then was read the Address to his Lopp: and the whole matter
 as then penned agreed on, and consented to.
