The Committee of both Houses proceed to Debate upon Several Acts Impor: - An Act Touching Judicature. Agreed that a new bill be drawn to Conteyne the sense of the sayd Act, and one other Act - Entituled an Act for proceedings at Law, Made Anno: 1664: and Presented to his Lordship.

2<sup>d</sup> An Act for punishment of Certayne offences against the peace and safety of this province read and debated, and agreed that a new bill now read be presented to his Lopp. for his assent, and the former refused.

3<sup>d</sup> An Act prohibiting the Transportation and Sale of his Lopp. ordinance 4c: was read, and thereupon agreed that a new bill now read repealing the former be presented to his Lopp. for his assent.

4<sup>th</sup> - An Act for taking an Oath of Fidelity &c: Agreed that a giving of our Allegiance to our Sovereign Lord the King: be added to the Oath.

5<sup>th</sup> An Act against Rayeing of Money within this province without the Consent of Assembly &c: and,

An Act Concerning Levying warre within this province both which Lawes are desired to be taken into Consideration, by the Grand Committee.

6<sup>th</sup> - An Act Touching Hogg and Marling Cattle agreed to be repealed.

1681: - 7<sup>th</sup> - An Act Concerning deserted Plantations, Desired by the Lower house to be amended. To which the upper house Answered that if the Lower house can find any way to Ascertayne his Lopp. Rent to him, they will concur with them therein.

8<sup>th</sup> An Act for Recording the Journall of the Lower house Read and thereupon agreed that a new bill be drawn leaving out the word Adjournment. - The Committee adjourned to the house.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

The house adjourned till To Morrow Morning 7 a Clock.
