Upon Debate of Two Messages sent this day to this House, about Townes  
was drawn y<sup>e</sup> following Message - (vizt.)

Lower House of Assembly April y<sup>e</sup> 21<sup>st</sup> 1684.

This House concur with y<sup>e</sup> Upper in their two votes this day sent, that  
a Towne be affoynted at or near Tippawan on the south Side of Manetocke  
River, as also at the head of Portobacco Creeke. And this House desire to  
know if the coffee house doe consent to y<sup>e</sup> Several votes and places &  
agreed on by this House, and mentioned in a list sent to the upper House  
on Saturday last. Signed for her, W<sup>t</sup> Boteler, C: B: of y<sup>e</sup> Lower House etc:

Which being read and signed was sent to y<sup>e</sup> upper House by Capt:  
Smith and Mr<sup>r</sup> Flattan.

Mr<sup>r</sup> Feeny Darnall brings a Message from the upper House which  
being read is as followeth vizt:-

This House doth concur in all points with the lower House in their  
Message on Saturday last relating to Townes, according to their severall  
votes therein mentioned.

Then came the Committee for perfecting and amending of Laws. And  
present to this House y<sup>e</sup> following Bills - (vizt.)

A Bill Entituled an Act touching Indictive and Proceedings thereon.

A Bill Entituled an Act for punishing of certayne offences against  
y<sup>e</sup> peace and Safety of this Province.

A Bill Entituled an Act prohibiting his Maj<sup>s</sup> Ordnance, Armes &c  
to be Imbezelled etc.

A Bill Entituled an Act for Recording of Journals of y<sup>e</sup> Lower House.

A Bill Entituled an Act for Killing of Wolves.

A Bill Entituled an Act for appropriating Count Days in each respective  
County.

A Bill Entituled an Act for Taking of Oath of Fidelity &c.

Every of which bills received its first Reading in this House towards  
its passage.

Then was read the petition of Michael Taney, for a Towne in  
Battle Creek upon his Land, and that the same may be soe layd out  
as to reserve his houses thereon built to himselfe. Whereupon was Endorsed  
as followeth -
