at Seven o'clock to morrow morning as desired.

which message being read and signed was sent to the upper house  
by Maj<sup>o</sup>. Long and Mr. Francis Hutchings.

Upon consideration of the Message this day sent from the upper  
house by Coll<sup>o</sup>. Stevens, was drawn y<sup>e</sup> following. whereupon thereto.

Lower house of Assembly April 22<sup>nd</sup> 1684:

All bills which have been presented to by this house are already  
transmitted to y<sup>e</sup> upper house, there being other bills which have had their first  
reading in this house, and so soon as perfected shall be presented to y<sup>e</sup> upper  
house for their assent.

Signed order B<sup>t</sup> Boteler C<sup>h</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> Lower house etc.  
which message being read and signed was sent to y<sup>e</sup> upper house by Capt<sup>o</sup>  
Orborne and Mr. Fisby.

Ordered that Mr. Attorney General and Mr. John Roseby draw up a  
Message in answer to y<sup>e</sup> Message of the upper house this day sent by Coll<sup>o</sup>.  
William Burges and Mr. Henry Sewall with the six bills and present of  
same to this house by seven o'clock to morrow morning.
