The Lower house is desired to Expedite to this house what bills and  
 other business they have before them this night, his L<sup>o</sup> now in the  
 house having signified, to this house his Resolution of meeting both  
 houses to morrow morning to discourse with them fully, his sentiments  
 upon the severall bills prepared in order to put a speedy end to this session.

The Committee for drawing the Supplementary Act come into the house  
 and present a Bill Entitled a Supplementary Act to the Act for  
 Advancement of Trade which was read the first time.

Coll<sup>o</sup> Diggs brings a Message from the upper house which being read  
 is as followeth: Upper house April 22<sup>o</sup> 1684:

The hon<sup>ble</sup> Coll<sup>o</sup> William Diggs and Coll<sup>o</sup> William Bugeys nominated  
 and appointed by this house to joyn in Committee with some of the Members  
 of the Lower house to Inspect and State the publick Acc<sup>ts</sup> to morrow  
 morning seven a clock.

In Answer whereunto was drawn the following Message.

Lower house of Assembly April 22<sup>o</sup> 1684:

This house have appointed Capt<sup>o</sup> Smith Mr. Clem<sup>t</sup>. Hill and Mr.  
 James Paisly - to joyn in Committee with the hon<sup>ble</sup> Coll<sup>o</sup> William  
 Diggs and Coll<sup>o</sup> Bugeys by the Upper house appointed to settle, state, and  
 inspect the publick Acc<sup>ts</sup> of this Province, and shall be ready to meet  
 at seven a clock to morrow morning as desired.

Signed Order, G<sup>o</sup> Boteler Cl<sup>o</sup> of the Lower house  
 which Message being read and signed was sent to the upper house  
 by Mr. Long and Mr. Francis Hutchings.

Upon Consideration of the Message this day sent from the upper  
 house by Coll<sup>o</sup> Stevens, was drawn the following Answer thereto.

Lower house of Assembly April 22<sup>o</sup> 1684:

All bills which have been assented to by this house are already  
 transmitted to the upper house, there being other bills which have had their first  
 reading in this house, and soe soon as perfected shall be presented to the upper  
 house for their assent:

 William Bugeys and Mr. Terry Sewall with the six bills and present of  
 same to this house by seven a clock to morrow morning.
