

Then was read the Act for Reviving of Temporary Lawes of 2<sup>d</sup> time by Speciall Order of the house, and the Question being put whether the Act for Killing of Wolves shall stand in 4<sup>th</sup> bill of Reviver of the Temporary Lawes as it is now drawn - Ye or Nay. Voted in 4<sup>th</sup> Affirmative.

Whereupon the sayd Bill for Reviving of Temporary Lawes was read the third time by Speciall order of 4<sup>th</sup> House and past this house in these words (Viz) April 4<sup>th</sup> 24<sup>th</sup> 1684.

The Lower house have assented: Signed for order. C<sup>t</sup> Boteler C<sup>t</sup> R. Ye.

The sayd Bill then sent to 4<sup>th</sup> App<sup>t</sup> house by Capt. Smith and Mr. Hatton.

They returns and say they have delivered the same.

The Bill for Naturalizing Jacob Beth. read 4<sup>th</sup> 3<sup>d</sup> time by Speciall Orders of 4<sup>th</sup> House and past in these words (Viz) April 4<sup>th</sup> 24<sup>th</sup> 1684.

The Lower house have assented - Signed for order. C<sup>t</sup> Boteler C<sup>t</sup> R. Lower house.

The Bill for Naturalizing Nicholas Bebraach, read 4<sup>th</sup> third time by Speciall Order, and past this house in 4<sup>th</sup> Same words as the former.

The Bill for Naturalizing Peter Bayard, and others, Read the third time by Speciall Orders of the house, and past in 4<sup>th</sup> Same words as 4<sup>th</sup> former.

Then was drawne the following Message (Viz)

Lower house of Assembly April 4<sup>th</sup> 24<sup>th</sup> 1684:

Upon Reading 4<sup>th</sup> Several Bills of Naturalization of the severall persons therein named, This house hath Considered that there hath been usually payd to the Speaker of the house of Commons in England, A considerable fee upon the passing any private Act, This house having seriously Debated the same - Resolved that all persons that shall be Naturalized this present Sessions of Assembly doe respectively pay unto 4<sup>th</sup> Speaker of this house the sum of twelve hundred pounds of Tobacco for 4<sup>th</sup> fees of their Naturalizac<sup>o</sup>n, And that the like be payd to the Speaker of 4<sup>th</sup> Lower house for 4<sup>th</sup> future, and that the Clerkes fee of the Lower house be three hundred pounds of Tobacco for every Naturalizac<sup>o</sup>n and noe more, And this house desires the Concurrence of 4<sup>th</sup> upper house therein -

Signed for order. C<sup>t</sup> Boteler C<sup>t</sup> R. of 4<sup>th</sup> Lower house Ye.

Then came Coll<sup>o</sup> Stevens from the upper house and says he has order to informe this house, That there was notice given of a mistake in the Act for Advancement of Trade concerning a port Towne or place of trade in Wighcotomoco River in Summersett County, which place in the sayd Act is mentioned to be upon the land next above 4<sup>th</sup> land of the Orphans of Charles Balland - Whereas the same should have been mentioned to be upon a parcel of land called Lotts wife, or the land which was formerly William Wites, which mistake is not amended in the supplementary Act, to 4<sup>th</sup> great Inconvenience of the Inhabitants of the sayd River, Therefore desire the same maybe mended.

He alsoe bringeth 4<sup>th</sup> sayd supplementary Act assented to, in these words:
