

April 24th 1684: The Upper house have assented,
Signed order, John Lewellin C^h: of Assembly.
Coll^o: Stevens alsoe brought a message at y^e same time, which being read
followeth (viz.) Upper house April 24th 1684:

The Additionall and Supplementary act to y^e act for Trade, hath passed
this house, and is now sent back to y^e Lower house who are desired to
returne to this house, The severall Bills before them for Naturalizacions
with there assent thereto. Signed order, John Lewellin C^h: of Assembly.

Then was Mr^r: Bayford, Mr^r: Cavile and Mr^r: Rously sent to y^e upper house with
the three Bills for Naturalizacions and y^e message, about a fee to y^e Speaker.

They returne and say they have delivered the same.

Then came the members of this house from the Committee of Accounts
and Report to this house the allowances by them made, which being ratified
by this house, the sayd members are ordered to prepare a bill for payment
of the Publique Charges, soe farre as they have proceeded in allowances.

Mr^r: Clement Hill a member of this house, desired to be allowed for a horse
by him lost from St^o: Marys two yeares ago, when he was in service of his
County as a delegate thereof.

Itoted that Mr^r: Hill ought to be payd for y^e sayd horse, and by St^o:
Marys County for which he was and is a delegate.

Then came Coll^o: Darnall from y^e upper house and brings with him
the act of Reviver of y^e Temporary Lawes, and y^e following message. (viz.)

Upper house April 24th 1684:

Upon reading the bill for reviving y^e Temporary Lawes of this province
this house doe say, that the words (soe farre as the Court shall Judge them
not inconsistent with y^e Condition of this province which is not to
stand revived) relating to y^e act Concerning Proceedings at Law ought
to be rased out of y^e bill, and y^e act for Killing of Wolves is a
perpetuall Law, soe made Anno 1676. and cannot properly be
brought into a Bill of Revivo But if both houses shall deem the
sayd act unnecessary or of noe use the same ought to be repealed.

This to be considered and accordingly provided for by the Lower house
in y^e Reviving act before this house can thinke of passing the same, be
absolutely contrary to the result of his topp: upon sound reasons given
to this house and communicated to the Lower house in a message from
hence yesterday. The Lower house is desired to have their assent to y^e bill
for Naturalizacion of Jacob Seth Imperfectly sent up to this house) now
plainly expressed - and returned to this house.

Signed order, John Lewellin C^h: of Assembly.

Ordered that the assent of this house to the bill for Naturalizing Jacob
Seth be made plainly Expressed, which was done.
