

Upper House April 24<sup>th</sup> 1684.

His Lopp. having referred the day of Session (appointed to be this day untill Saturday next) this house have determined to have the Enor<sup>th</sup> here depending argued before them some time to morrow. If the Lower house can conveniently spare their members therein concerned as Attorneys on either side, to which this house desire an answer.

In answer to y<sup>e</sup> last message from y<sup>e</sup> upper house by Mr. Tosty Damall concerning a day of Session and the Arguing Enor<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Carville and Mr. Buiford were sent to y<sup>e</sup> upper house to acquaint them that this house hath much business before them, and understanding that the Clarke of this house is concerned as an attorney in some of the Cases to be tryed, doe signify that if this house can spare their Clarke from the urgent business of this house towards the afternoon to morrow the upper house shall receive further notice thereof from this house.

The House adjourns till to morrow Morning 7 a Clock.

Friday April y<sup>e</sup> 25<sup>th</sup> 1684.

The House mett, and Called, all present as yesterday.

Then was read what was done yesterday.

Upon further debate concerning y<sup>e</sup> Act for Killing of Wolves, protested by this house that y<sup>e</sup> Act made for Killing of Wolves in Anno. 1671. be left out of the reviving bill, because it appears to this House, that the sayd act being made Temporary is expired, and cannot properly take force againe without a new bill drawne and passd both houses & with his Lopp<sup>s</sup> Assent.

Then was read a bill Entitled an act for reviving y<sup>e</sup> Temporary & Lawes of this Province the act for proceedings at lawe and the act for Killing of Wolves being left out of y<sup>e</sup> sayd bill.

Putt to y<sup>e</sup> Question whether sayd Bill of revivall shall pass, the sayd two acts being left out as aforesayd. - Passd in y<sup>e</sup> Affirmative.

Capt. Hill and Capt. Peerce sent to y<sup>e</sup> upper house with the sayd Bill of Revivall and the bill for Naturalizing Jacob Seth.

They Returne and say they have delivered the same.

Mr. Carville then sent to the upper house with the supplementary act to the act for Advancement of Trade, and ordered to notice to y<sup>e</sup> upper house that y<sup>e</sup> sayd bill is mended by drawing over y<sup>e</sup> two first Sheets and Inceiting the words therein as was desired by y<sup>e</sup> Serball (message by Coll<sup>o</sup> Stevens. Hee Returnes and says he hath delivered the same.

And that the upper house say that as soe boone as they have perused y<sup>e</sup> bills they will returne them.
