

And the House proceeded to the further Consideration of the 4th Proposals yesterday layd before them, and as to the 6th Proposal (viz) 6th That the County Courts for the future be kept at our auncient Town for our auncient County -

Resolved a Bill be drawn for the same -
7th That an address be drawn and sent to the Lords of the Committee of Trade and Plantations acquainting them, that we can supply His Majesty's Navy with severall Naval Stores, viz.

Pitch, Tarr, Malt, Cards, Stems, and Cordage upon twelve Months Notice, and desiring they would propose to us what Quantities and what Method of Payment for the same -

8th Proposed that some Means be used that we may give assistance to New York according to her Sacred Majesty of ever blessed Memory's etc.

Whereupon Resolved that assistance of Men shall be given when need shall require &c.

And because the Country is already destitute of Money to pay the Soldiers now in Arms for the Defence of this Province, The Honble Thomas Taster Esq. one of the Members of this House offers to lend for the Service of the Country two hundred pounds Sterling if need shall require for the Loan thereof untill he shall be enabled to be reimbursd himself out of the County Treasury, he is to be allowed eight pounds per Cent for the use of the same, and the said sum is to be called for by his Ex^{ty} of the said Taster, and applied to their Mat^{ty} Service in such Manner as to his Ex^{ty} in his wisdom shall seem fit.

9th Proposed that for raising a further Supply for the Service of the County there be layd an Imposition upon Negroes and Servants imported.

Resolved that an Imposition be layd upon Negroes and Servants imported - An additional Act to the Act for better administration of Justice in Probate of Wills and granting Administrations &c.

Read the first time -

Voted what shall be the Imposition upon Negroes & Carried by Majority of Voices ten Shillings per poll.

Resolved Nemine Contradicente that an Imposit be layd on White Servants imported of 2^l. 6^s. per poll, and that a Bill be brought in for the same -

Resolved that an address be drawn to His Maty. Condoling the Loss of Her Maty of ever blessed Memory -

Resolved His Maty be addressed representing how incapable we are of giving assistance to New York and our desire to be discharged from Her Maty's Commands therein, and that Mr. Mills be joynd with the Honble G^o Thomas Laurence Barr^o their Maty's Secretary of this Province to present our address to His
