A Bill for assessing the publique Levy, and A Bill for Dividing the severall Countys.

An additional Act to the Act for ports and Townes, read 4<sup>th</sup> time. Recommended to this House by His Ex<sup>ty</sup>. that the publique Revenue may be stated before the breaking up of this Session.

An additional Act to the Acts for ports and Townes, read the second time.

An additional Act for the better Regulating the Militia read the third time.

The House adjourns till 7 a clock to Morrow Morning.
