England that their Lordships would be pleased to make such
proposals to this House to be considered on as may answer the
Ends designed.

Put to y^e Question, whether such Letter shall be writ, accord-
ing to his Exe^c proposal and Carried in y^e Affirmative.

Resolved the Committee of Laws prepare the said Exe^c-
That the House write to my Lord Arch Bishop of Canterbury and
the Bishop of London to thank them for their favor and friendship
to this Province and to begg y^e continuall thereof.
