

19th That such Horses as are allowable by the Law to be killed be taken up and sold to the use of the poor of the parishes.

Resolved that there is a Law of this Province relating to Horses which is thought very sufficient

20th That there be a person appointed to execute the office of Muster Agent upon each side of Bay who shall be obliged to Muster and see exercised the several Troops and Companies, six times every year besides the 4th Muster and that two pounds of Tobacco be settled upon each of said officers.

Voted and Resolved that this Province is not in any Capacity to comply with the proposal, or settle any such office upon such Muster Master Agent being already fore engaged in vast Summs of Money and Tobacco

21st That what money is already received by the duty upon Furs be laid out towards the building of a small School house and maintaining a School Master. according to proposals made last Session of Assembly.

Voted and Resolved that the said money be kept in Bank.

22^d That an Ordinance be made for the Levy to be laid by the Gov^o and Council, and Justices of the Provincial Court in the place.

Voted if according to the proposal the Levy shall be laid - and repeated (nomine Contradicente) the same being an infringement of the Rights of the Subject.

23rd That a Law be made that what Priests hereafter come into the Country be obliged to produce their Orders in such a time, and if they do come not to many any protestant to a parson without receiving a certificate from some Minister of the Church of England of such protestants being managed by a Minister of the said Church first.

Resolved that the Laws have sufficiently provided therefore.
