

Revolution, then Reports be examined and taken into Consideration according to Reference of ye House made last Session.

Resolved that ye said Reports be laid before ye House.

26th That Colonel Heiman be directed with to know whether the Stad-house will be covered before winter and that he be obliged to secure ye same safely from ye weather - before that time if he cannot finish it.

Resolved till Col. Heiman appear in the House - and in Case he do not take Care to doe the same - Ordered, that ye Overseers of ye publique Works take Care to see ye same secured.

27th Whereas it hath pleased Allmighty God to prosper his Majesty's Affairs both by Sea and Land, proposed that a day be appointed Same according to an Order of Council last March Especially for ye happy News of his Majesty's safe Returne being suspended untill now for ye more Solomne performance thereof.

This House humbly desires his Ex^{ty} will appoint a day therefore - 28th That a Clause be inserted in ye act for Towns that no person coming to ye port of Annapolis be arrested - within that port unless his stay shall exceed forty eight hours, and a penalty be inflicted upon the Officer transgressing therein.

That some Priviledges be given to them that are, or shall be Inhabitants of that port and Town at present, or shall come within two Years hereafter and actually reside within ye same for seven years together thence ensuing, shall themselves with their posterities have and enjoy all Priviledges now to be granted, or which hereafter at any time shall be granted forever. And to finde out some way or other to encourage them - it is proposed - that no Inhabitant of ye said port be Lyable to be arrested in any County of the Province or any other place save within ye Liberty of ye said Towne and port, that ye Inhabitants of ye Town pay no County Levy, nor to have to doe with any County Roads Clearing but what are in or about ye said Towne.

That an Act pass empowering ye Townes People to purchase a Common and for ye Commissioners of ye said Towne to Make byelawes with power to fyne any persons Inhabitants, Committing breach thereof in such Summe to be ascertained. To assest ye Conduit made at ye publique Charge - that ye Common be well cleared with ye points of Land, and ye place dividing ye Common to be well ditched.

That an handsome pair of Gates be made at ye coming in of the Towne, and two triangular Houses built for ye Ranges. To have the way from the Gate to go directly to ye top of ye Hill without ye Towne and to be ditched on each side and fitt with Quilt fitts or some such thing.
