11. That a Law be made that of inhabitants of of two parts of Annapolis -

and William Stad<sup>t</sup>: May be exempt from the penalty of ye Act - agt.  
Fore states and Regrators, and that of said Law may not reach them.

Resolved that the actual Inhabitants of of Two parts of Annapolis and  
William Stad<sup>t</sup>: be exempt from of penalty of ye Act agt. Forestall and  
Regrators.

evidence agt. of S<sup>r</sup>. Clarke.

Henry Mathew and Sarah his wife appearing in of house, and being  
sworne before Major Hamont one of his (Maj<sup>ty</sup>) Justices of the provincial  
Court, The said Sarah deposed that on (Monday) Morning being the fourth  
instant she saw the prisoner upon a Large Dark Bay horse, having an  
changing (Maze) with a bove Tyle and Branded on of Narr. Buttocks (that)  
the (middle being) Lemfley - that Richard Clarke kept out of the Road along  
of fence side till out of of Gate - and then put on very fast.

Capt. Bayne one of the Members of this House alledgid that he lost his  
horse on (Monday) Morning last having the above brand, and in every  
particular of same as of said Sarah had described.

Rich. Clarke alledgid of horse was his owne and that he could produce  
of same before this house with all convenient speed.
