

That whereas Thomas Meale Esq. (Ma^r of his Ma^{ty} Royall Mint) had offered his assistance in Relation to our Act for Advancement of Coyne now in England, that this House would write to him and intreat his Friendship therein. Resolved a Letter be write to Thomas Meale Esq.

That in Regards ye Fleet is expected in and that provisions are scarce and may be much wanted by ye Fleet especially if they winter here, that ye House would have some Order pass to prohibit the Exportation of provisions.

The House desire his Ma^{ty} will be pleased to issue his proclamation a^g ye Exportation of Coone, as for ports there is no necessity of publishing the Exportation thereof.

What shall be done with the Bills taken for the Imposts upon Goods &c - Ordered, that they be delivered to the publique Treasurers of this Province who are to send them home this Shipping and take Care to have them received and securely Lodged for ye ends designed.

That ye 2^d part of ye publique Revenue due from Gen^l Coxleys Estate being 470th Sterl^r, allotted for ye purchasing Arms and Ammunition for this Province be taken into ye Consideration of ye House.

Resolved his Ma^{ty} be addressed therein -

That to ye end that business may be Carried on, with ye more quick Dispatch, by obviating some Objections which by ye House may be put - the following Quere are putt ^{over}.

If Skins and furs brought out of Pennsylvania and Shipt here sh^ould ought not to pay duty as others reported, and that some Order pass to enforce such persons who have exported Skins and furs to pay the duties thereupon.

It is ye Opinion of ye House that ye Act is sufficient to Compeell them. That such persons as at their own proper Cost and Charges will build and keep bridewell, that they have a Lease and ye benefite thereby. Assented to by ye whole House. Memorie Fortificatioe.

That suspected persons going over potomacke with goods horses be examined and not suffered to goe over.

The Lawes have already provided -

That as to former proposall touching Pennsylvania Trade and Seamen travelling without passes being Matter of great Moment for this Ma^{ty} Service during this tyme of Warre ye said proposall is therefore more particularly urged and recommended.

Resolved that his Ma^{ty} proclamation touching Pennsylvania Trade, and Seamen travelling without passes duly observed and put in Execution by his Generall Magistrates and other inhabitants of this Province.
