A Bill for annexing Wye Miles River Kent Islands and Several Creeks to the ports of William Stad<sup>t</sup> - read and passed.

By the Committee Reported that there is in Bank for building the Church at Annapolis 458<sup>l</sup> Ster<sup>l</sup>. We have discouered Workmen and the Carpenter demands for his work 250<sup>l</sup>. The Bricklayer having all stuffe upon the place 220<sup>l</sup>. The Brickmaker 90<sup>l</sup>. We find no other means to raise money therefore without the assistance of some Charitable disposed persons, we also find that the charge of building the said Church will not amount to less then 1200<sup>l</sup> Sterling.
