The Committee of Lawd and all other Committees Sent out a House adjourned unto Mr. Speaker's Chamber this postre at 7 o'clock to Morrow Morning. House met and Called over.

Then Reads over what was done yesterday.

Major Walter Smith appears in the house and takes his place.

Reported to this House from the Committee of Grievances, that the Committee having passed the Act for empowering the Com^{tee} of the County Courts to levy and raise Money to defray the necessary Charges of their Courts and for that the Committee made no penalty or fine therein, so that they continually augment the County Charge and the Partye agreed have no redress. Therefore the Committee conceive it a great grievance and humbly represent that a Law with a penality be made on half thereof for defraying the County Charge the other halfe to the informer.

Whereupon, Resolved that it be referred to the Committee of Lawd, to inquire whether the Law be sufficient or not.

That the Committee find it an grievance that the Sheriffs and Deputy Commissioners in the several Countys exact and extort fees contrary to Law coloured by taking Bills therefore.

Thought fit that a Clause be inserted that no Sheriff or Deputy Commissioner hereafter take or extort any Bills from any person whatsoever for any fee unless the account and particular thereof be rendered on the said Bill so that the party agreed may be relieved, otherwise such fee to be void.

Referred to the Committee of Lawd to prepare a Bill for it is therefore likewise the Committee represent it as an grievance, that the State Testymen, Justices, of the several Countys of this Province for very slight occasions have been arrested, summoned and compelled to appear at Annapolis to there great damage and charge, therefore may be ready for the future.

Resolved that Mr. Michael Miller and Mr. William Taylard draw up an address to his Excy the Govr to redress y^t grievance.
