Gregory's letter to the Hon^{ble} S^r Thomas Lawrence Barr^{ter} His Maty's Secy^{ry}

Mr. Gregory presented Mr. Speakes with a letter from His Master and
an Order of King and Council.

But the dispute of the Land Office is further deferred to the
next Session of Assembly.

A Bill ascertaining the divisional bounds between Ann Arundell
and Baltimore Counties read the 1st & 2^d time and passed.

A Bill empowering Elizabeth Norman widow Executrix of George
Norman dec^d to make over two Tracts of Land to John Gadesby,
read 1st & 2^d time and passed, and sent by Mr. Harris, the other
Gentlemen with the address.

House adjourned till tomorrow Morning 7 o'clock at 4th

Saturday March 7th 20th 1698.

House met, and called over absent, Mr. Crauford and Mr.
Serkins. Then read over what was done yesterday.

The Journal of the Committee of Accounts read.

Several Remarques by his Ex^{ty} the Governour and His Maty's Hon^{ble}
Council upon the Resolves of this House upon their proposalls taken
into Consideration, and debated and Resolved on as followeth.

And first that a Law shall be made directing how Controversies
shall be decided between Masters and Servants and Servants and Masters.

Resolved the Committee of Laws draw up a bill therefor.

Whereas the proposalls relating to Ordinary keepers and receiving
of Letters brought in by Masters of Ships are matters of great consequence,
the House is desired to send some of their Members to confer with
the Members of y^e Hon^{ble} Board.

Resolved that Major Hammond, Mr. Willmer, Mr. Eliza Hall,
Mr. Benj. Hall, Mr. Ashman, Mr. Collins, Mr. Saunders and Mr. William
Hutchison go and attend their Maj^{ty}'s Council upon the said conference,
and that Mr. Hutchison and Mr. Saunders go and know what time the
said Conference shall be held.

As to the proposall or Recommendation that what grievances are
received from severall parts of the County His Ex^{ty} and the Hon^{ble}
His Maty's Council expect to see and fruse that Committee Journal
as also the Journal of the house of Delegates.

What grievances we have received are communicated from our
Generall Electors to us - and are referred to our discretion, which we
have already in parte represented.
