Moved by a member that whereas there is 347^l 5^s 6^d already in Bank besides what is in Mr. Mafons hands unaccounted for, that if His Excellency and the Honorable Council will agree with this House the same or three parts thereof may be applied towards defraying the Charge of this present Assembly, and that the Gentlemen appointed to apporportion the publick Levy who may be Impowered to dispose of the same for that use and no other.

And that the publick Treasurers may produce there Accounts of what Tob^o is in their hands by the usual upon offices to the Committee appointed to apporportion the publick Levy who may be Impowered to dispose of the same towards the defraying the Charge of this present Session of Assembly and to no other use.

Whereupon Resolved the following Message be sent.

By the House of Delegates April the 1st 1098.

This House humbly desire that whereas there is 347^l 5^s 6^d already in Bank besides what is in Mr. Mafons hands unaccounted for, the Gent^l appointed to apporportion the publick Levy this year may be Impowered to dispose of the same, or at least three parts thereof - for defraying the Charge of the present Session of Assembly and no other use, and that the publick Treasurers may be obliged to produce their acc^{ts} to the said Committee of what they receive this Session by the usual upon offices which we also desire the said Committee may have power to apply and dispose of to y^e use afo^{re} and no other.
