

At a Sessions of Assembly begun and held at the
 Court of Annapolis the Twenty Eight Day of Octob^r. in the Tenth year

The Hon^{ble} Coll^l Henry Jowles and Thomas Tench Esq^r two of His
 Maj^{ties} Hon^{ble} Councill enter the House and inform Mr Speaker
 that His Esq^r in His Maj^{ties} name commands Him and the whole
 House to attend Him Instantly att the Councill boards.

Coll^l Henry Jowles and Thomas Tench Esq^r depart
 Mr Speaker with the whole House goe up to the Councill Chamber.
 Att the Councill Chamber.

His Esq^r was pleased to recommend to the House the Consideration
 of severall Letters which he had rec^d from the Lords of the Committee
 for Trade and Foreign Plantations.

 Speaker having taken the Chair adjournes the House for an hour.
