Major John Lowe, Mr. John Whittington, Mr. Benj^m Hall, Mr. Walter Camp-
bell, Mr. Sam^r Young and Major Mr. Bartow returned and say they have
delivered the address. Capt. Hall appears.

Moved by a member of this House that some way be thought on how
