 Thus Gent^l: We having taken more pains then your Message desired
 to give you an Answer to it and it is only for the sake of many honest
 and Loyall Gent^l: belonging to your house who are apt to credit others,
 who are not so well disposed such as it seems by this paper are
 aggrieved.

1. That the Gov^r: send home the Journalls^{ve} - as he is Comanded, and did
 not trust them with it.
2. Those that are aggrieved he will not suffer them to abuse, detest
 or vilifie his (Maj^{ty}) Authority and Government when they please
 in their debates.
3. That the Gov^r: should expose to publick any that have proved
 Malignant disturbers of the peace and quiett of this Province and
 openly scandalous.
4. That his Exc^{ty}: will not suffer the Justices to impose what Taxes they
 please on his (Maj^{ty}) - Subjects.
5. That he will demand and have acc^t: from the C^l: of proceedings
 in the house and committees.
6. That his Exc^{ty}: should suffer the Law to be put in Execution ag^t:
 Jurors suspected of being and false verdict.
 But those we believe are only pretensions, it is in reality the Kings
 Government they are aggrieved at. And may they either Consent to their
 Obedience or long Ven^{ce}: so aggrieved.

It is not to be doubted but the Province may Lac^r and sev^l:
 aggrevances such as the Letter fall several Temporary Laws by
 which the Country reap great benefit spending so much time
 and Treas^{re}: as now hath been in doing very little settling the
 disputes daily arising ab^t: the bounds of Land, settling the matters
 between the Lord Baltimore and his (Maj^{ty}) subjects here about the
 conditions of Plantations &c - and many other things of like nature
 which would better become your Care and time.

So desiring you seriously to Consider what you have done and
 what you have and ought to do we bid you farewell.
