Whereas his Exc^{ty} and Council has been pleased to grant that Eight hundred pounds Sterl^o out of the publick Stock of this Province, shall be applied towards the defraying the publick Charge of this Province to be paid at 4^s Sterl^o at 1000^l Tobacco.

It is recommended to the Council whether they will have their whole allowance in Money or shall be appropriated according to the several Summes of Tob^o to be paid in the Publick Levy and for such of the Hon^{ble} Council as will be willing to have all their allowance in Money that they will be pleased to signify the same to this House.

The House mett againe and were called over, and were absent Capt. Tho. Manghops, Mr. Philip Clarke, Mr. James Crauford, Capt. Philip Hopkins, Mr. Benjⁿ Hall, Mr. John Ferey, Mr. Mr. Hutchinson and Maj^r Mr. Barton. Put to the vote that for as much as Mr. Mr. Hutchinson and Maj^r Mr. Barton had s^umptuously left the house whether they should be fined for such their Contempt or past over. Carried in Affirmative. Put to the vote whether they should be fined 500^l of Tobacco or 1000^l of Tob^o. Carried by the Majority of voices for 500^l of Tob^o.

Ordered that 500^l Tobacco be deducted out of their Sall^y.

Resolved that the Vane, Globe, and other thing therunto belonging.
