

A Bill Entitulado an addicorall act to the act Entitulado an act for speedy
Justice for Small Debts, Read the first and second time.

A Bill for the Reformation of Geogles in this Province, read the first & 2^d time.

Resolved that £ two fynes of Five hundred pounds of Tobacco each
deducted out of y^e allowances to Mr. William Hutchison and Major Will^m
Barton be applyed to the payment of John Newton for Sweeping and
Cleaning the State House.

The House adjournes till to morrow Morning Eight of Clocks.

This Saturday Nov. 12th 1698 - The House Magazine, and were called
over, were absent Mr. Philip Clarke, Mr. James Crauford, Capt. Philip
Hoffman, Mr. Benj^m. Hall, Mr. George Ashman, Major Thomas Innalls,
Mr. William Hutchison and Major Will^m Barton.

Resolved that Major Thomas Innall for his p^{re}sumptious going
home and leaving this house without leave first obtained, one thousand
pounds of tobacco, and that the same be deducted from his allowance.

Resolved if this House shall make answer to His Excy. and the Hon^{ble}
the Councill's Reflections in their severall Messages.

Whereupon it was put to the vote, and carried in the affirmative.

Ordered, that ye Committee of Laws draw up such an Address.

Ordered that Mr. John Whittington Mr. Jacob Moreland, Mr. Samuell
Young Maj^t John Lowe and Mr. James Saunders carry the afores^d Bills
to His Excy. and Councill. They returne and say that they have desired y^e same
The Committee appointed to confer with two of his Maj^t Hon^{ble} Councill
in the house and by Capt. Rich^t. Hill they make report.

It was proposed by their Hon^{ble} what was the reason they could
not comply with what was desired in an act for promotion of
Learning and advancement of his Maj^t Free Schoole of Maryland.

To which was answered that the house did apprehend that
their Complyance would be a barre to y^e Reire if any and that it
would also be a barre to y^e Lord^s property of his right to Excheats.

After many arguments there hon^{ble} were pleated to send for His
Maj^t Attorney General who read in the Civil Law, severall p^{re}dict
upon the reading of which the Committee was inclined to dispense with
that part touching the Reires, and drawing to conclusion of Conference.

We could not consent that that part touching the Reires p^{ro}p^{rietary}

Their Hon^{ble} desired that the Committee, would give a favourable
account thereof to the house the whole being for a prious use, thereby to
induce the house to dispense with both y^e Objections by them made.

W^tch this Committee promised to doe.

Resolved that the Sixty pounds in the Journall in May 1697 sent to His
Maj^t to pay three Ministers, be allowed to his selfe for y^e Councill Chamber,
Gregory, Clerk of the House of Delegates
