The house adjournes till to morrow Morning six of clock.  
Sir Ben<sup>r</sup> July 7<sup>th</sup> 1699. The house met againe and were  
called over, Read what was done Yesterday.

The Message Yesterday sent relating to the Armes and Ammunition,  
and referred till this Morning, was read -

Resolved that three whole Barrells of Gun powder be sent into  
every Respective County to be kept for the Countys Service to be lodged at  
the discretion of the Coll<sup>l</sup> or Chief Military officers in the said County  
and seven whole Barrells of Gun Powder to be lodged in the Magazine  
in Annapolis - And the remaining parts to be sent to the severall  
Collonells or Chief Military officers of the severall Countys to be  
disposed of and that the Armes be lodged in the Gen<sup>l</sup> Magazine  
except the Drums and Trumpetts which may be disposed of to the
