By his Exc^{ty} the Gov^r in Council in Assembly July 8th 1699.
Gents.

Your Message by Mr. Saunders and Mr. Tilghman, I have
communicated to his Majesty's Hon^{ble} Council who upon Consideration
of the Subject advise -

1. That as his Majesty's pleasure is that I shall keep soe likewise that I
shall use the publick Seale and that necessarily implies, may have in
and Judge of Chancery Causes with such assistance as shall be required -
2. That for that purpose Two of his Majesty's Hon^{ble} Council shall be
joyned with me for my assistance therein.
3. That if any Person not satisfied with my Decree they shall have
liberty to Exhibit their Bill of Review in the determining whereof I
shall have the assistance of a full Quorum of his Majesty's Hon^{ble}
Council not less than five in Number.
4. That if either partye are dissatisfied with such finall Decree they
may appeal to his Majesty in Council according to his Royall Instructions
in that point, if the Matter in Dispute amount to the sume limited.
5. That if it be doubted any inconiueniency may arise by this Method
the Law may for once by his Majesty's Royall Instructions be made
Temporary till time and Experience in the practice has Granted
approbation or note.
