Ordered that Mr. Jacob Moreland Carry the conveyance for the Land at the Coole Springs to the house of Mr. John Dent and Sumon two of the nearest Justices of St. Maries to take the acknowledg^{mt} of the said Land from the said John Dent and his wife and that he returne with all Expedition.
