The Honble Francis Jenkins Esq^r one of his Maty^s Honble Council and Mr. W^m Bladen Cl^k of the Council Enters the House and Mr. Jenkins brings Back the Bills opened to this Morning and Informs Mr. Speaker that his Ex^{ty} has commanded him to administer the Oaths to Major W^m Whittington.

Major William Whittington took the Oaths appointed by Act of Parliament instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy and subscribed the Test and Association and having performed the same took his place in this House accordingly - And his Maty^s Honble Council departed - Mr. Richard Telferman Enters this House and brings into this House severall Laws which are continued to be infore and a List of the same. Resolved that they be sent to his Ex^{ty} and Council and that a message be prepared therefore.
