

Six Inches asunder and to be planed with two Inch Planks and the  
Planch to be turned to Sleepers, and the Upper floor to be as the  
Lower floor and of the same Scantling and to be overlaid six inches  
on each side and the foot of the principle Rafters to be seven and nine  
Inches and the top five and a half and seven Inches and the small  
Rafters to be five and four Inches and the said house to be covered with  
Pine Plank and Shingles above of plank and the Lower room to have  
a partition in the Middle made with timber and Plank and a door  
to be at each end of the said house for the two Lower Rooms to be two  
foot and half wide and six foot in the clear and to be made with  
two inch Plank well lined with Inch Plank with good strong  
hinges and the door for the Upper Room to be at one end of the said  
house and to be six foot high in the clear and to be two foot and  
half wide and the Upper Room to be sealed with Inch Oak plank  
and the Rafters to be seventeen foot from the plate besides the foot of  
the Rafters and one window frame in each Lower Room two  
foot and half high and twenty Inches broad with Iron Bars  
Revetted through and two window frames in the Upper Room the one  
at the one end of the house and the other by the door and of the same  
dimensions with Iron Bars Revetted through as aforesaid with two Locks to  
each door the one within of other without with an Iron bar cross  
each door.

By the Council in Assembly July 20<sup>th</sup> 1699.

This Board according to the desire of the house of Delegates of the 17<sup>th</sup> of  
July Instant Ordered the Mr. Gen<sup>l</sup> to draw a Bill concerning Marriages  
and present to of House which is done but noe answers given what is become  
of it, therefore the same is againe Recommended to your Consideration if  
any thing therein seeme necessary to persons intending Marriage or if any thing
