The Committee appointed to examine and State the publick acct^s of Mr. Phill. Lynes enters the House and report as follows.

That in Obedience to an Order of this House they have inspected into the Journals of Accounts since the Year of our Lords 1692, and doe find that all allowances have been made him which was found to be justly due to him from the publick and that they find Mr. Phill. Lynes petition referred to the Assembly in June 1692 was Granted and he referred to each Mans particular acct^s according to his petition and it is their Opinion that it is not the publick due to paye.

To which Report this House gen^{lly} concurs.

The petition of Jacob Regmers for removing the publick powder out of this House purchased of Joseph Hill, was here read and Considered.

This House conceives that Capt. Rich. Hill had formerly lett the House in the petition mentioned to the County for a publick store, for powder till they were better provided.

Therefore resolved that the publick powder be still lodged there, till the County shall be better provided with a more convenient place for that purpose.

The House adjournes till tomorrow Morning 7 a Clock.
