Bill for imp^{ro}vt of 3^d pth &c. read again with the Amendments, and Resolved by the House that it continue but two yeares and to the end of the next Sessions of Assembly after the said two yeares.

Which was sent up to his Exc^{ty} and Council by Mr. Mr. Dent and Coll^o Tho^s Ennalls, they returned and say they delivered the same.

The House adjourns till two o'clock in the afternoon.

The petition of Edw^d Laddemore recommended this House from his Exc^{ty} and Council together with a Bill for Divorcem^t therewith sent was in this House read.

And having Considered the same that for as much as the prayer of the petitioner is of soe high a nature that this House doe not think fitt to pass the bill this Sessions, but have Resolved that if the pet^r will appear here the next Sessions of Assembly and bring with him such witnesses or other evidences sufficient to prove the Ellopm^t &c then this House will take it into further Consideration.

And Ordered that the pet^r give notice to Elizabeth the wife in the petition mentioned that she likewise then appear here to make her defence if to her it shall seem meet.

Mr. James Smallwood having shewed to this House calling him home humbly prayed Liberty of this House to depart, it being granted he takes his leave and Departs the House.
