The Petition of Dan^l Canning Gatekeeper relating to G^o Repairs of the
 Towne fence - was againe read and Resolved the same fence
 be repaired - and Ordered that the said Canning Cause the same
 be repaired for which he shall be satisfied at Laying the Levy.

The Message and Paragraph of the Lords Commissioners of Trade
 and Plantations are which his Exc^{ty} to this House brought in this day
 from the Hon^{ble} Council was also read - and

Ordered the same be againe read and answered to morrow

The petition of Gerrard Sly of St. Marys County Merchant for an
 allowance for a house: burnt in service in the time of G^o Revolution
 was here read and debated.

And Resolved the same be wholly rejected.

Another petition of the said Gerrard Sly wherein he prays for redress
 that writt of restitution - be awarded upon the reversal of Judgment
 had before his Exc^{ty} and Council wherein erroneous Judgment
 was granted ag^t him in the provinciale Court upon an Indict^{mt} at
 of his Maj^{ty} G^o. Was also read and debated and is by the
 House - Resolved it be rejected - for as much as he have relief at
 the Common Law - and is referred to the Court of Appeals for
 restitution if any of right belongs to him.

And another petition relating to the execution of one Field for
 belt and costs - de novo read - this House reject G^o same and
 refers the petitioner to the Comon Law for his relief.
