

To His Excellency, the Governour, and  
Counsell in Chief of the Province of Maryland.

The Petition of Hugh Eccleston, John Hodson, Joseph  
Cunnalls and Roger Woodford of Dorchester County on behalf  
of severall the Inhabitants.

Number Showeth:

That about the Year 1704. a certain Humphrey Hubbard  
was constituted and Appointed Deputy Comptroller of the said  
County, and during the said Year and next Year following did  
take the Probatt of severall Wills of severall of the Inhabitants of  
the said County, and thereupon granted Administrations, as alsoe did  
take the Involys. of severall Estates and Accounts, and Probatt of  
the same made up before him according to the Act of Assembly in  
such case provided, And your said Petitioners further take leave  
to informe your Excellency and Honor that in the Year 1705. Com-  
ing up to the County General Court in order to Returne the said  
Wills Involys and Acc. into the said Office an Accident by fire  
happned, whereby not onely the Boat of the said Humphrey was  
wholly consumed, but alsoe all the said Wills Involys and Accounts  
were wholly consumed and turned to Ashes by which means sundry  
of the Inhabitants, having Lands and Legacies bequeathed unto them  
by the said Wills and severall Orphans and Creditors on the Loss  
of such Involys and severall Poor Ignorant People having Exhib-  
ited and made up such Accounts and not having Copies of the same  
are likely and will if not remedied, suffer very much some to their  
disinheritance and ruine.

The premises considered, your Petitioners humbly pray, that  
a Bill may be brought in, to relieve the said sufferers by Enacting  
that the Copy of the said Wills Involys and Accounts now lodged in  
the County Court Office and proved to be a true Copy by the Oath of the  
said Humphrey may have the same power and effect in Law as the  
said Originals if they had not been burnt.

And your Petitioners as in Duty bound shall pray
