Livered to in Council. — Bladen Ch. 8: —

Which said severall depositions were here Read in this house and being  
fully debated and Considered, the house find it relates to some high  
Crimes and Misdemeanor Supposed to be committed by Mr. Joseph Hill a  
Member of this House; Therefore Ordered that Mr. Joseph Hill withdraw  
the House till the Matter in the Depositions be further debated.

Upon which Mr. Hill withdrew.

And then the House did further proceed to debate the matters laid to  
his Charge, and the depositions being Read and fully Considered — It  
was moved by a Member that it may be putt to the Vote whether the  
Crimes laid to Mr. Hill's Charge (as in the Depositions is set forth) be  
sufficient to Expell him or no.

Which being likewise debated —

It was afterwards putt to the Question whether it be sufficient to  
expell him or not carried in the Affirmative — Thereupon Resolved  
to be dismissed and Expelled this House till he be cleared of what is  
laid to his Charge.

Upon which Mr. Hill was called into the House — It appeared  
and Mr. Speaker to acquaint him with the Vote and Resolve of  
the House aforesaid.

And soe withdrew.

The House adjournes till to morrow Morning eleven after  
Saturday: the 52<sup>nd</sup> April 1707.

The House mett again were call'd over and present as  
yesterday only Mr. Hill.

Read what was done yesterday.

Upon reading the Report of the Committee Appointed to inspect the
