

The following Message by Col. Lloyd and W^m Coursay Esq^r Ordered
the same to Entred Vice.

By the Governor and Council in Assembly

April 33rd 1707.

The Houses answer to the Council's proposal by Col. Holland
and Mr. Sanders was received here and upon mature Consideration the
Board cannot omitt acquainting you that we are sensible great
complaints have been made of that part of the Law for Pounding debts
and particularly in a Cause, Mr. Somersett brought in the prov^r against
John Branock wherein the Chief Justice's Opinion was over ruled
by the rest of his brethren.

This securing the 40th Job^r of poll, as was proposed in case
it should happen to be in any particular Vestry Man or Sheriff's hands
neither are any Vestry Man obliged or ever do give Security to
Account therefore.

And as to the Quakers contributing to the Charge of the
Militia your Answer is very wide of the Recommendation which
is that being the Quakers scrupulous bearing Arms in person, her Majesty
thinks fit that they should be compelled to hire or otherwise supply
such men who may be Capable and fit to do their duty in that
and service in that Station.

And the Board are not for having any body person
executed before day in Court given to hear his defense, yet we are
desirous to render every Branch in the Act for the better Ordering
and Regulating the Militia as efficacious as may be.

Therefore wish you award Execution against the Body of
such Freeman upon their default certified by two Field Officers
provided such fine exceed not one hundred pounds of Tobacco at
one time, and this will not be a greater Violence to liberty than the
power given to Justices to hear and determine small debts who
award Execution for 200 Tobacco against the Body.
