And as to those Paragraphs of your Excellency's Speech relating to the Publick Interest this House unanimously agree to concur with you in what good Laws are recommended for the good and benefit of her Majestys Subjects here, and all other things by your Excellency recommended we will take into Consideration and debate and will consent to any thing further, that in our Judgment shall be for her Majesty's Honour and Service, and for the good of her Subjects here.

Your Excellency's good Government over us we acknowledge and desire as well for her Majestys Service as the good of this Province and having found our selves safe under the same do wish your Excellency health and happiness and pray that you may long continue in her Majesty's favour.
