Bill Ascertaining Attorneys fees and the following Message By the Council in Assembly December 24<sup>th</sup> 1708.

Upon Reading the Bill Ascertaining Attorneys fees &c Wee Recommend the Sum of 400. Tob. in lieu of 200. be all Attorneys prosecuting or defending any Cause Plaintiff or Defendant of what nature soever in the Provinciall Court to final Judgment Agreement or other End, for all fees in the High Court of Chancery Vice Admiralty or Writts of Error and Appeals before the Governour and Council 600. Tobacco, The fees in the Common Pleas Court 400. Tobacco We think the words (near just take) be well omitted in the said Bill for that we never heard any person practising the Law or others were ever prohibited from receiving any fees gratuity or Reward from their Employers who Judged them worthy thereof, further we recommend that it be inserted in the said Bill that all persons, practicing the Law shall be sworn before the Governour and Council for the time being before Admittance into the Courts who shall notwithstanding have the power of admitting by swearing them and likewise suspend on Justices
