Court, not to hold plea in any action by Originall writ where the debt or Damages sued for amounts not to thirty pounds Sterling or Seven Thousand five hundred pounds of Tobacco.

This House upon debating the Aggrievances herewith Sent Pass Resolv'd that there is no way to prevent the same but by limiting the Jurisdiction of the prov. Court, by an act to prevent the prov. Courts holding plea by Originall writ in any action where the debt or Damages amounts not to thirty pounds Sterling or Seven Thousand five hundred pounds of Tobacco and pray the concurrence of the Honble Council thereto.
