Bill confirming persons rights to Towne Lands the second time Read and Comitted for Amendment

Edward Harris petition praying leave to bring in a Bill to Supply the defect of three Evidences to the will of Richard Briggers deceased - Read and leave given to bring in a Bill as pray'd.

Committee of Laws enter the House and deliver M<sup>r</sup> Speaker - Bill for continuing S<sup>t</sup> Mary's County Court house at Seymour Town which was Read and Comitted for Amendment

Bill reviving the Act for importation of Broad Beer &c which was read, putt to the Question whether the Bill pass or Not Carry'd in the Affirmative and order'd to be indors'd

By the House of Delegates 30<sup>th</sup> October 1710 - Read the third with the Amendments and will pass

Resolved upon a Motion made by a Member of this House that a Clause be inarted in the Act for securing persons rights to Towne Lands - That nothing in the Act shall prejudice the Right of Richard Bennett Esq<sup>r</sup> to the Land laid out for a Towne at Worton Creek in Kent County.
