 Jones Forrest at the Head of Middle River would be a convenient
 place for a Court house, It's put to the Question whether it be left
 to the Vote of the inhabitants of Baltimore County to appoint the
 the place where they would have their Court house or not
 Carry'd in the Affirmative And Resolv'd Mr James Phillips Mr Cou-
 Stephenson and Mr William Talbot, or any two of them
 on the first Tuesday of April next Meet at Richard Jones
 Forrest and Mr Pace, Mr Dotahide and Mr Rich. Colegate or any
 two of them at the same time meet at the new Court house at
 Loppa, and the said persons at those places, at the times afore-
 said, to take the Votes of all the freeholders Living in the said
 County at what place they desire their Court house shall be plac'd
 and make report of their proceedings to this House the next Session

Order'd that Sam^l Young Esq Publick Treasurer of the Western
 Shore pay to Cap^t Thomas Newman Greenfield and Mr Henry Perrin
 Bowles the Tenn pounds formerly lodg'd in his hands for
 the Hopkico Indians, and Mr Greenfield and Mr Bowles are to pay
 the same to such of the said Indians as have right thereto and make
 report thereof to this House the next Session of Assembly.
