inhabitants thereof to their great Damage oppression and
Aggravance — It is therefore Ordained by the Honble President
Council and Assembly of this Province and the Authority of
the same — That the Justices of Prince Geo:
County Court doe not presume upon any pretence whatsoever
to continue that ferry at the County charge any longer than their
Novemb. Court this present year 1711 — and that they yield all due
obedience to this Ordinance as they and every of them will
answer the contrary to the next General Assembly
