

Repealing the Act for Appeals and regulating writs of Error
and the following Message.

By the Honble President and Councill in Assembly

November 3^d 1752

In Answer to your Message by Major Hammond and three other of your
House desiring us to communicate to you the reasons laid before her
Majesty for repealing the Act for Appeals and regulating Writs
of Error, We herewith send you her Majesty's Order in Council for
repealing that Law by which you will observe the reasons inducing
thereto.

care may be taken to prevent the ill consequences that may happen
by want of such an Act
